## **Characters:**

Tūtū - A “grandmotherly” older woman. The storyteller.

Kahi - Mouse #1 (Hugh), a little bit of a mischievous rascal. Wears a shirt with the number 1 on it, and a backwards baseball cap, with a long braid down his/her back.

Lua - Mouse #2 (Nick). Wears a shirt with the number 2 on it, and a backwards baseball cap, with a long braid down his/her back.

Kolu - Mouse #3 (Tom). Wears a shirt with the number 3 on it, and a backwards baseball cap, with a long braid down his/her back.

Wahine - the Farmer’s Wife (Mary), a bossy bully.

Kamoa - a lazy Rooster
